ABOUT SOLID WASTE REGION BOARDS



The 1991 Solid Waste Management Act required Tennessee Counties to form municipal solid waste regions. While some regions are multi-county solid waste regions, many counties in Tennessee formed a single county region. This was the case with Davidson County.

Solid waste regions were required to appoint a board that represented the cities and county within the region and to administer the activities of the solid waste planning region. Members serve for a six-year term (TCA 68-211-813).

The roles of the solid waste region board are the following:

1

Create a 10 Year Solid Waste Management Plan to reduce waste entering MSW landfills by 25% and ensure adequate disposal capacity. Each year the region board is required to submit an “Annual Progress Report” the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation describing any changes in the 10 Year Plan, current recycling and disposal data and future needs for the region.

2

Review permit applications for solid waste disposal facilities or incinerators within the region. The board is required to review the application against the 10 Year Plan and determine whether the application is in compliance with the plan and TCA 68-211-814.

3

Flow control or restricting import/export of solid waste across the region’s boundaries. Davidson County does not restrict the movement of solid waste.

State law also allowed for the creation of solid waste authorities. Solid waste authorities are entities having administrative, financial, and technical power to implement regional solid waste plans and programs. Davidson County did not opt for a solid waste authority.

Markets/Infrastructure: Markets create an obstacle for diversion, but is further crippled by lack of investment in technology and infrastructure. Our MRF is privately owned and investment in their facility has been minimal. Their Nashville MRF is the oldest MRF they own across multiple countries. That lack of investment in their infrastructure limits our current ability to recycle more materials including polypropylene and glass in curbside carts. Even as we look to start a public-owned facility thanks to funding from the EPA, markets will continue to remain an obstacle as most product packaging does not currently have viable markets in the southeast.

Funding: To increase diversion, funding remains a barrier to investing in infrastructure that would allow the county to offer increased services and diversion programs including recycling, organics, and C&D. Particularly difficult is funding based on the city's general fund that our department competes against Health, Fire, Police, Schools, and more with.

Staff: In the last calendar year we have received an additional 30 positions to build out a new department fleshing out a robust operation that services over 400K stops on a monthly basis for residents of Davidson County. We have also insourced trash collection for 50,000 households establishing new collections foundation structure. What we lack is the staffing needed to pursue compliance and enforcement of permitting and generator fees that are currently not being paid to the department's solid waste fund. This funding shortfall would significantly fund expanded diversion programs for the entire county while providing the capacity to enforce the current solid waste code for the benefit of all Nashvillians.

Citizen Apathy/Education: Residents continue to have a mistrust of recycling systems for a variety of reasons, many believing that their recycling just goes to the landfill. Each education effort made helps combat this problem, but consistency of information from the national, state, and local levels including the news media is needed to remove the uncertainty at the resident level. The confusing nature of recycling, such as the misleading chasing arrows labeling, also impacts residents' willingness to participate in recycling. What you can and can't recycle messaging varies between Metro, satellite cities, and in surrounding counties despite that we can only recycle the same types of materials. We also must compete with third-party websites that try to aggregate this type of information for multiple places that are often incorrect.

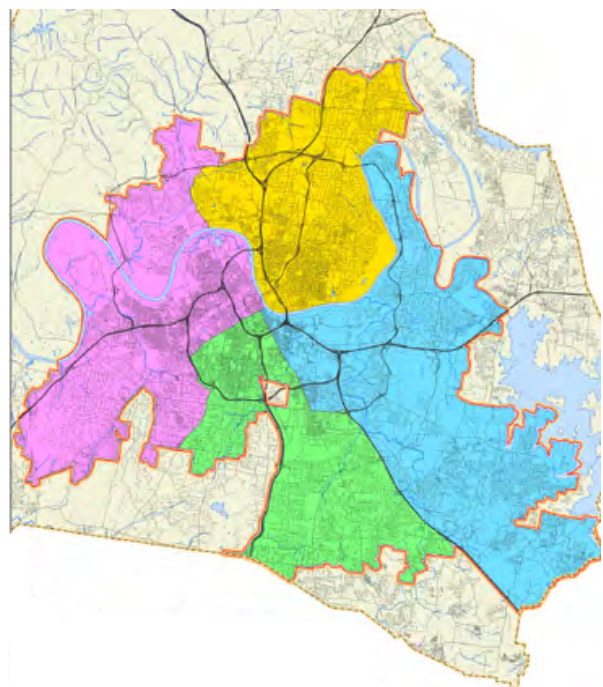

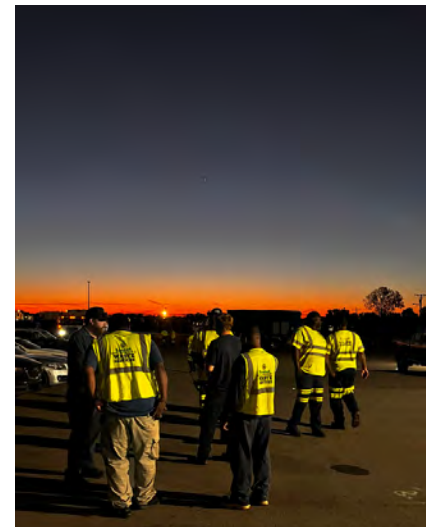

1. Are there any policies, statutes, rules, protocols or ordinances that inhibit the county and municipalities from having effective programs? Reference specific statutes, rules, policies or documents when answering the question.

HB1021– This restricts local governments from adopting policies to regulate the use and sale of auxiliary containers, which is defined to include plastic bags and straws, from food and food service establishments. Plastic bags, single-use plastic utensils, and straws are not currently able to be recovered for recycling in the Middle Tennessee region, and they are unable to be regulated so are becoming waste to landfill or ending up as litter or in waterways. This policy specifically prohibits our ability to enact policies that support our Solid Waste Management Plan and efforts to reduce waste to MSW landfills. Downtown Nashville continues to be a significant generator of waste from glass bottles and this policy prevents our ability to minimize this excessive waste.

TCA 68-101-109: Labeling of Plastic Containers - This labeling continues to be misleading regarding the recyclability of materials. This confuses our customers on what can and cannot be recycled, increases contamination in recycling which directly affects the costs of the program, and creates a lack of confidence and trust in our program from our customers who see us as limiting what we can recycle, rather than only accepting materials that are actually recyclable.

TN Const art VI § 14: No fine for citizens to exceed \$50 unless assessed by a jury. In practice, the most egregious violators of local solid waste code, particularly businesses are not deterred by this minimal amount even if levied per violation per day. When this was established in 1796, that amount would have been a serious fine whereas in 2026 this restriction makes fines inconsequential for changing behaviors. This could include, but is not limited to, fines for disposing of cardboard, electronics, and yard waste in trash containers rather than diverting this material from landfill.

2. Are there any parts or utility of the 10 Year Solid Waste and Materials Management Statewide Plan, Plan Update or Annual Progress Report the county and municipalities do not understand?

3. What role can Materials Management play to be the biggest resource to the county and its municipalities?

Support the growth of regional infrastructure

The more counties and municipalities that have recycling programs, the more volume of material can flow into a materials recovery facility giving a natural economic incentive for more infrastructure investment. If the state can help counties or municipalities that don't have curbside recycling programs establish those programs, it would benefit all nearby counties and municipalities to recycle more. This could include connecting counties and municipalities with resources including grants, best practices, and contracting assistance.

Support for outreach efforts

Landfill permitting and regulatory compliance comes up regularly in Davidson County, particularly in North Nashville/Bordeaux where we have an open C&D landfill privately operated and the closed Bordeaux landfill. As we look to move new policy forward that addresses diversion, this includes outreach to this community to make certain strides. It would be helpful if resources could be provided to assist with helping community members understand varying questions and misinformation around landfill permitting as well as have staff available to attend occasional public meetings to support local efforts. While these issues run deeper than permitting, having more context from the state perspective that regulates landfills would be helpful as we work to build trust with these communities.

4. What areas would you like to see the Division of Solid Waste Management focus on in coming years to help the county and municipalities be successful implementing the Region's plan and programs?

Infrastructure Investment and Incentives

To move the needle on recycling, we need the infrastructure to improve recycling sortation, increase access to recycling programs regionally and state-wide that supports regional recycling programs, and increase markets for recycling more materials. We need more processors that are driven by recycling and not landfilling and more options for marketing materials regionally rather than sending all our material mostly out of state.

5. What is needed in the county and municipalities to further waste reduction, recycling, diversion or end markets in Tennessee?

Processing infrastructure

Processing equipment that can effectively sort and collect more commodities for recycling. This includes polypropylene, glass, and bulky plastics. We also need additional infrastructure to increase capacity to collect organics and C&D material.

Funding

Currently Davidson County's solid waste program is funded under the general fund and does not include fees for service. This limits funding for program expansion and infrastructure investment due to the competing needs of funding within Metro Nashville. Additionally, the department needs increased capacity to go after permit fees and generator fees that are owed to Metro, that we currently lack the staff to address.

Support for organics diversion in schools

With so many federal school lunch guidelines, MNPS students generate a significant amount of organic waste every day in the cafeteria. Any increased support to help schools build successful diversion programs would be beneficial to capture this material.

More competition from private processors

Nashville needs more competition from processors that have a mindset for recycling and diversion first. We have been stagnant in recycling efforts as landfill rates remain lower than recycling and investment in infrastructure or incentives for private investment has been minimal.

6. §68-211-871(b) requires an annual progress report on the implementation of the regional comprehensive integrated municipal solid waste management plan. What steps are the county and municipalities taking locally to contribute to regional plan implementation?

Applying for Grants and Philanthropic Funding

Recently NWS was awarded EPA's SWIFR grant for \$2.4M that will fund infrastructure to build a scalable materials recovery facility to be publicly owned. Nashville was 1 of 17 awardees out of over 350 applicants. This will give us the leverage to increase diversion of different materials without the hindrance of private interests. NWS also received a donation from the Polystyrene Recycling Alliance to implement a drop off foam recycling program. This is in process of being implemented. NWS continues to look and apply for additional grant opportunities to support this work and other work of the department to increase diversion.

Operational Investment and Enhancement

Improving our operations is essential to providing the level of service needed to reach higher diversion targets. This includes creating more efficient routes and utilizing advanced routing technology to ensure service delivery, both of which were recently implemented. Additionally, building out our compliance team to help enforce cart compliance including recycling right will help increase the quality of material recovered and educate our residents about recycling.

Organics collection

NWS has been able to continue its pilot curbside organics collection program through the use of department operational funding. In collaboration with the Mayor's office, the MNPS school cafeteria pilot that ended summer 2025 was a proven success, but still demonstrates the financial challenges to larger scale implementation. A report with findings was prepared for MNPS leadership and NWS continues to support efforts to fund this program in the future. In 2024, Nashville was awarded Government Recycler of the Year by the Tennessee Recycling Coalition for this program.

Library and MNPS Recycling Pilot Programs

NWS actively supports other departments and agencies looking to implement successful recycling programs. We have implemented a pilot at the Nashville Public Library in four branch locations to start recycling both through the services that we provide and contracted services. We are in discussion of how we could expand this pilot to other branches. We are also working with MNPS leadership to establish recycling at schools, starting with a pilot group of schools that already demonstrate leadership in sustainability.

7. Describe any success stories on programs or efforts made in the last year

East Center Upgrade

NWS underwent a significant capital project to implement long-needed upgrades to our oldest Convenience Center. The grand reopening of the project in early November included increased safety features such as safety railings, high visibility painted areas, speed limit signage, reorganization of the HHW building, and wayfinding signage. The upgrade also focused on reframing the center for recycling. The final upgrades will result in a safer environment for residents to recycle and the grand opening allowed for promotion of the various recycling programs available at the center for Davidson County residents.

Growth of Department

As a brand new department for Metro Government, in the past year we have substantially grown our staff expanding the reaches of departmental operations and expertise. This has included a fully operational dispatch team, a large compliance team, a significant increase in middle management, a fully staffed finance and HR team, a council liaison, and more. This growth means a greater capacity to reach departmental and diversion goals.

Food Scraps Pickup Pilot

Originally planned as a one-year pilot, Nashville's Food Scraps Pickup Pilot's (FSPP) overwhelming success and community enthusiasm have led to its continuation beyond its initial timeframe. As of February 13, 2026, the FSPP has diverted 474,500 pounds of food scraps since collection began. On average, each household diverts 6.6 pounds of food waste every week with a weekly set out rate of 81.38%. Contamination is also extremely low, averaging 0.27% per week compared to our recycling contamination rate which hovers just above 20%.

Explain Equipment Needs and Facility Upgrades

NWS has received an intent to award for EPA's Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling grant and will be embarking on the building of Nashville's first publicly owned Materials Recovery Facility. This grant covers some equipment, but additional equipment will be needed to increase the types of materials we can accept and market. This includes but is not limited to a glass crusher and glass cleaning system to incorporate glass into curbside recycling, optical sorters to improve paper and plastic recovery, ballistic separators, and no-wrap equipment that reduces the impact of plastic bags in the sorting process.

For facility upgrades, our East Convenience Center was recently fully upgraded, but our other three convenience centers need upgrades for safety of both residents and staff as well. This includes paving, striping, wayfinding, safety railings, and more.

We also currently do not have a proper building or warehouse for both staff and equipment. Our trucks are exposed to the elements 365 days of the year, which impacts the longevity of the equipment. Additionally, staff are disconnected in multiple different buildings both on site with the trucks and off site at another location. This makes effective collaboration between divisions more difficult, impedes flow of communication, and impacts staff morale. A dedicated Waste Services building, vehicle garage, and storage warehouse all in one location will be critical to advancing the services NWS provides.
