Old Business

- **Update to Member Reappointments for 2026**

There are six (6) NHWLC members whose terms are set to expire in February and March 2026. The staff contacted these members to assess their interest in continuing their NHWLC membership. Only Freida Outlaw indicated that she will not seek reappointment. Members discussed appropriate names to consider as it relates to the 2026-2028 CHIP and other NHWLC initiatives. Tracy Buck shared a brief PowerPoint (attached) highlighting the membership sectors outlined in the NHWLC bylaws and the Executive Order. The members spent time discussing missing sectors: Mayor's Office, Metro Council, Seniors, Affordable Housing, and Legal. Members settled on an affordable housing developer who will be contacted by staff. If this community member is interested, their name will be shared with the mayor's office. - **Work Plans**

- **2026-2028 CHIP Dashboard Give-Get conversation**

Chair Robert Robinson extended an invitation to Carleigh Frazier to lead the NHWLC members in the requested Give-Get conversation on the 2026-2028 CHIP dashboard.

Members were divided into 3 groups for the exercise and given 2-3 minutes for individual brainstorming for the NHWLC Give and Get. The small groups collaborated on the NHWLC Give-Gets. Each group provided a report, which was recorded online. Metro and VUMC shared their Give-Get input (attached), which had been gathered pre-meeting. Groups were then led through a facilitated discussion on Expectations and Assumptions. The task-level gives and gets were also recorded in the RACI Matrix (attached), which had been pre-populated by Metro and VUMC staff.

Members are asked to review the attached RACI Matrix for additional discussion at the March meeting. The final Give-Get grid and the RACI Matrix will be eligible for approval at the March meeting.
