VII. OLD BUSINESS

04-26-04 Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement on property at 92 WHITE BRIDGE PIKE, NASHVILLE, TN 37205, (Map and Parcel10311000100), to serve as a connector to the Richland Creek Greenway. This greenway easement will conserve 0.438 acres of open space and support expansion of the Richland Creek greenway network. The easement dedication was a condition of the Planning Commission's approval of the final site plan for Novel Richland Creek. 2021-009-002. Council District 24.

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- 04-26-05** The Centennial Park Conservancy requests approval to install an engraved Crabtree stone section at the entrance of the new Event Pavilion located in Centennial Park to recognize Phase III donors, organized by levels of contribution. Additionally, the Conservancy requests approval to install a donor recognition plaque at the renovated Croquet Café to honor contributors to the Phase III revitalization project. Two design options are submitted: one utilizing the Parks standard plaque layout and font, the other incorporating the Parks' approved Croquet Café branding logo. Council District 21.

The easement dedication was a condition of the Planning Commission's approval of the final plan for Osage Arbor at Broadmoor Phase I, 2017SP-034-004. Council District 5.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

- 05-26-02** The Centennial Park Conservancy requests acceptance of a staffing grant in the amount of \$24,215.05 to fund one part-time position in the Parthenon Museum Store. Grant to be distributed quarterly via reimbursement to Metro Parks. This grant requires no match or other obligation for Metro Parks. Council District 21.

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- 05-26-03** The Friends of Warner Parks requests acceptance of a staffing grant in the amount of \$65,560.73 to fund five seasonal and part-time positions. Grant to be distributed via quarterly reimbursement to Metro Parks Council District 34.
- 05-26-04** The Friends of Warner Parks requests acceptance of an S.W.E.A.T grant in the amount of \$46,660.89 to fund six seasonal positions. Grant to be distributed via quarterly reimbursement to Metro Parks. Council District 34.
- 05-26-05** The Battle of Franklin Trust requests Board acceptance of an in-kind grant of a portrait of Frank McGavock and a silver spoon inscribed “David and Willie” to Metro Government/Parks to be placed at Two Rivers Mansion. - 05-26-06** Centennial Park Conservancy requests approval of a lease agreement for Metro Parks property located at 2565 Park Plaza, Nashville, TN 37203. The property is approximately 2300 sq. feet of office space and 480 feet of open area. Council District 19.
- 05-26-07** Staff requests approval of a temporary construction license agreement with Opry Mills Mall Limited Partnership, associated with construction of the Opry Mills Connector greenway. The greenway will be approximately one mile in length, ADA compliant, publicly accessible and will provide alternative transportation to an area lacking in transportation access. This connector will benefit users by offering access to mature and scenic view of the Cumberland River. Council District 15.
- 05-26-08** The Metro Historical Commission requests board approval to install a new historical marker within Edwin Warner Park commemorating the Natchez Trace and its significance in early American transportation and communication. The marker will be funded through a donation from Friends of Warner Parks to the Metro Historical Commission. No funding or financial obligation is required by Metro Parks. Council District 34.

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05-26-09 The Historic Germantown Neighborhood Association (HGNA) requests approval to utilize a designated green space within Morgan Park for the establishment of a community garden. The initiative aligns with shared goals between HGNA and Metro Parks to promote healthy and active living, increase access to nutritious, locally grown food, and provide outdoor and environmental education opportunities. HGNA will be responsible for the installation, planting, and ongoing maintenance of the garden, which will also serve as a resource for community engagement and education in sustainable agriculture.
