Old Business

- **Update to Member Reappointments for 2026**

Chair Robert Robinson asked Tracy Buck to provide an update on the member appointment process. Tracy Buck reported that the first community member from the Housing sector declined the appointment opportunity. A meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 18, with the second person recommended. An update will be provided to members at the April meeting.

- **Communication Update**

Chair Robert Robinson asked Tracy Buck to provide the communications update. The website is in the queue for posting. We do not have a timeframe for the posting, but the link will be shared with members as soon as it is available.

- **2026-2028 CHIP Update**

- Work plans Review

Each of the CHIP Workgroups shared one work plan for 2026. They will have the opportunity to adjust these work plans and add additional plans as the work progresses. The work plans will be posted with the CHIP document for the community to review, follow the work, and join the workgroup if they are interested. The work plans are listed below. Key comments per work plan:

- *Housing* Objective 1.1-No one from the workgroup was present to share the work plan. NHWLC members requested more details (information on the organizations involved in the work plan, framing for the work product, and what questions this analysis will answer) from the workgroup at a future meeting.
 - *Awareness & Navigation of Community Resources*- Members recommended that MNPS be connected to the work plan. It was also recommended that the YRBS data should be used in this space.

- *Food Access/Food Insecurity*- Members were excited about the opportunity to learn more about hydroponics and aeroponics. This topic is being pursued as a joint activity between the Food Access/Food Insecurity and the Economic Opportunity & Job Skill Development workgroups. A request to have the hydroponic and aeroponic presentation will be extended to the Food Access/Food Insecurity workgroup.

- **2026-2028 CHIP Dashboard**

Chair Robert Robinson extended an invitation to Carleigh Frazier to lead the NHWLC members in the conversation on the 2026-2028 CHIP dashboard. Carleigh Frazier directed the members to the NHWLC CHIP Dashboard Summary (attached) and reviewed it. Questions were raised on the possibility of building out the RACI (**R**esponsible, **A**ccountable, **C**onsulted, **I**nformed) Matrix beyond the **R** that has been the focus of the current conversations. The members suggested that the next focus should be on the **I** (informed). A short list was generated in the meeting: Mayor's Office, MPHD Communications, MSS Communications, VUMC Leadership, and CHIP Workgroup Chairs. It was recommended that a full list be generated for those who should be informed of the CHIP dashboard, draft a letter, and send it to those on the list.

Chair Robert Robinson asked for a motion to move forward with the establishment of a CHIP dashboard hosted by VUMC, starting with the native data indicators, adding the non-native indicators over time as determined by the CHIP Workgroups, and including the build-out of the RACI, **I** section.

Motion was made by Tené Franklin, and a second was made by Haley Davidson. Motion was approved.

- **Review of the 2023-2025 CHIP Final Report**

- **Selective review of the County Health Council Assessment Survey**

For Davidson County, Chair Robert Robinson and Tracy Buck filled out the survey on behalf of the NHWLC. The complete survey results can be found in the attached CHCA Final PDF. It was intended to utilize the attached PowerPoint to discuss selected questions and compare the NHWLC's responses to the overall responses. However, technical difficulties with the computer hindered the discussion from taking place. Members were urged to examine the complete survey and

PowerPoint, which outlines the NHWLC's responses. Should there be interest from the members, this agenda item can be revisited.
